What To Bring:

- Medical Form for Youth and Adult (Required)

- Tents for two people
- Rain gear and outdoor footwear
- Full Uniform for Webelos Scout**
- Folding Chair
- Compass** (1per Webelos)
- Webelos Scout book, paper and pencil
- Label your gear
- Shovel to make fire pit (1 per pack)
- Charcoal, 20 lbs/ Pack
- Cooler with Ice**
- Large container full of water**
- Food for three meals
- Eating Utensils (fork, knife, spoon, plate)
- Drinking Cup (with name on)
- Sun Screen
- Sleeping Bag & pad
- Wagon/Car to transport your gear to campsite

Suggested Menu!

- 1) Bag Lunch for Saturday Noon and Beverage
- 2) Foil Pack for Saturday Dinner: Cut up; potato, carrot and onion, 1/2 lb hamburger or sliced smoked country sausage; salt and pepper to taste, TBSP water for steaming, wrapped in two heavy duty aluminum foil per person; and beverage.
- 3) Sunday Breakfast: Hot/Cold cereal, milk, juice, hot chocolate, fruit and coffee.
