

Camp Long Lake Sledding Rules

Sledding will only be allowed at the hill below the Carl Below flagpole and the Boes reception center. The sledding start point must be between the light pole and the rope fence.

There should be strict adherence to the Outdoor Winter activities policy listed in the current on-line edition of the “Guide to Safe Scouting”. This includes supervision at all times by two adults, one of whom may be 18 or older. The other must be at least 21 years old.

Jumps or ramps may not be built.

Downhill skiing and snowboarding are not permitted.

The camp masters or camp ranger may close the sledding hill at their discretion.

Units that do not adhere to the sledding policy will lose their sledding privilege.

There will be a snow fence installed to act as a buffer and help eliminate people sliding into the stairway posts.

Helmet use is recommended for all participants engaged in sledding or other sliding activities.

Remember, these rules are for Scout and Scouter safety – a safe outing is always a successful outing.
