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COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objective of this course is to help Scouting units extend their camping season to all 12 months of the year. It is expected that the participants of this course will go back to their units and share the knowledge and skills learned in this course.

Cold weather camping mistakes can be deadly. The skills learned in the Okpik Program will make cold weather camping an enjoyable and safe Scouting experience.

The Okpik Program will provide you with the knowledge and materials to conduct winter camping training within your units. This program covers the skills and techniques needed to ensure a successful, fun and safe cold weather camping experience include:

- Physical First Aid
- Emergency Procedures
- Shelter Building
- Traveling in Snow
- Making Equipment

Attendance at all three classroom sessions and the practical weekend campout are required to complete the course.

PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS

- Adults and Youth (14-17 years old) with unit leader permission
- Must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. This includes Youth Protection that is current through the end of the course
- Must have completed the basic training courses for your unit's position
- Annual Health and Medical Record form (parts A, B and C) must be handed in when the full payment is due
- Must operate in a patrol environment
- The Unit Leader must take into account the Scouts physical capabilities for high adventure activities as well as their maturity. Having attended National Youth Leadership Training is encouraged for all youth
- Must have fun!

ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS

Instruction is according to the program syllabus and provided the "Okpik Cold Weather Camping" book. This will give you all the material needed the "Bring it Back" to your unit.

More importantly participants will receive the knowledge and understanding of how to thrive in the fourth season of camping and the passion to pay it forward.
